






Figure.1. Total faith in Iraq to get this level of energy




Figure.2. total consumption energy in Iraq till 2018

SDG16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions

Sixteen Goal Means this goal is dedicated to the promotion of peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, the provision of access to justice for all, and building effective, accountable institutions at all levels Conflict, insecurity, weak institutions and limited access to justice remain a great threat to sustainable development. The number of people fleeing war, persecution and conflict exceeded 70 million in 2018, the highest level recorded by the UN refugee agency (UNHCR) in almost 70 years. In 2019, the United Nations tracked 357 killings and 30 enforced disappearances of human rights defenders, journalists and trade unionists in 47 countries.

- Having written policies and procedures to identify local stakeholders external to the university and engage with them.
