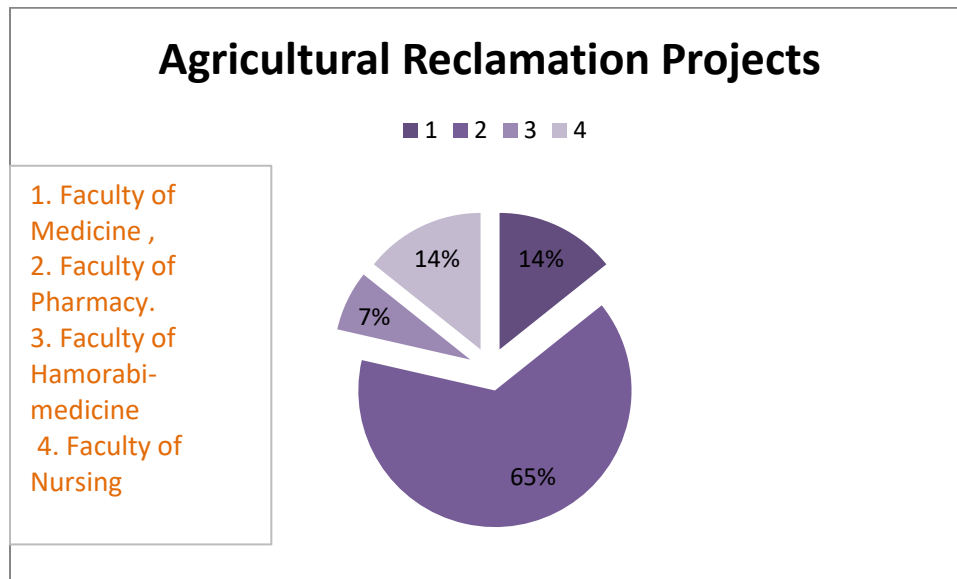

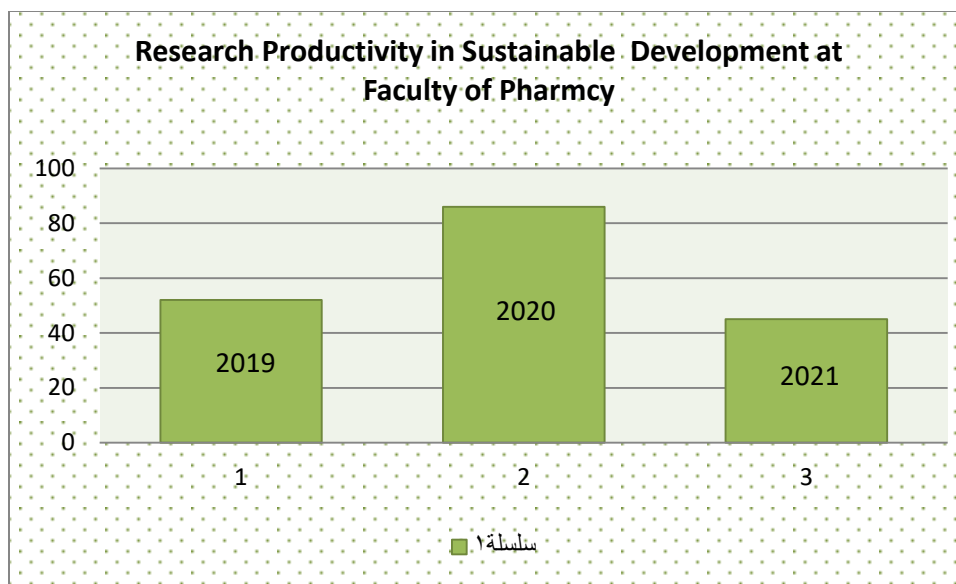

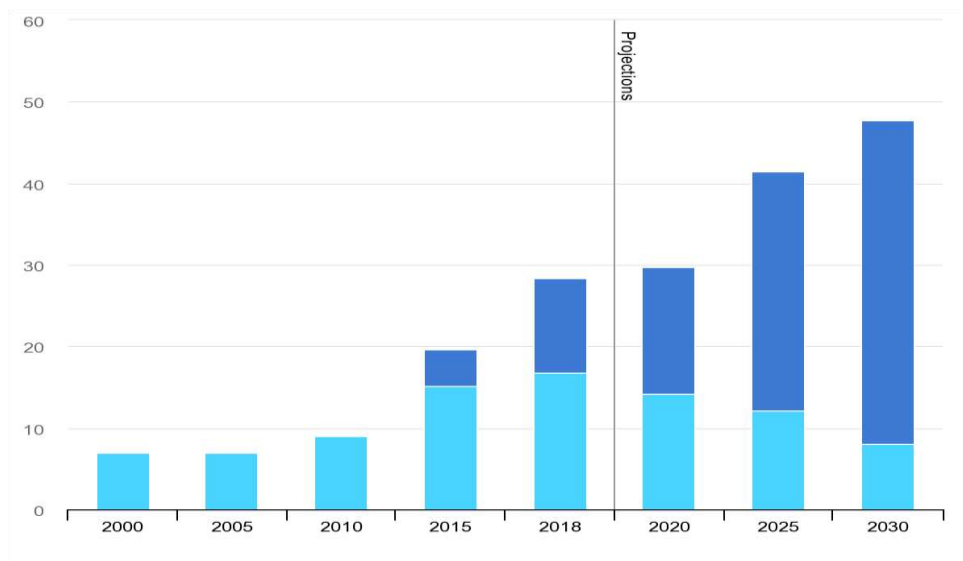


Figure.1. Total faith in Iraq to get this level of energy

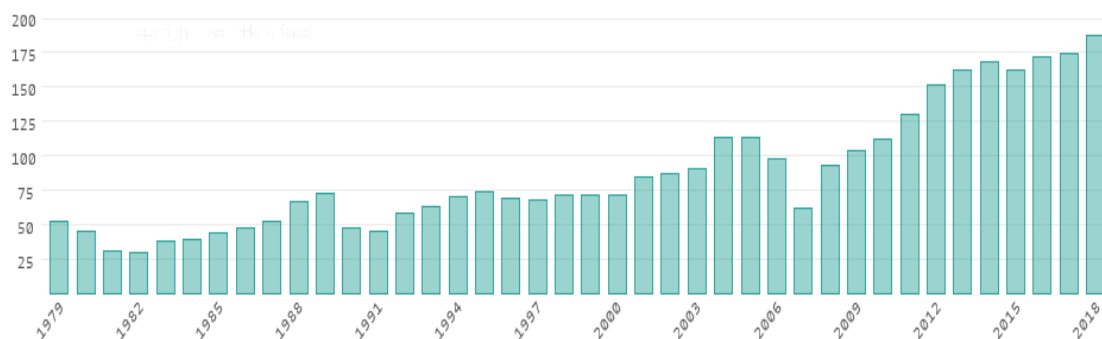


Figure.2. total consumption energy in Iraq till 2018

- Initiate and participate in cross-sectoral dialogue about the SDGs, e.g. conferences involving government/NGOs
- Reviewing comparative approaches and development international best practices on tackling the SDGs through international collaboration and research.
- Collaborate with NGOs to tackle the SDGs.
- Publication of SDG reports about the university progress.
